The Worcester Child Contact Centre

Providing safe spaces for children to meet parents they don't live with



Parenting shouldn't end when relationships do.



- When parents separate the relationships between adults can be difficult and conflict can arise making it difficult for parents to see each other or communicate for contact arrangements
- A contact centre may be able to help, offering a safe and neutral place for children to see the parent they don't live with or sometimes other close family members
- Supported contact sessions are held twice a month on a Saturday in group settings by trained volunteers
- Anyone can apply to use Worcester Child Contact Centre and it is a free charity
- Parents can be referred by a professional or self-refer through the National Association of Child Contact Centres website (NACCC.org.uk)
