5LS have been working hard this term. In science, we had a visit from the Animal Man. Pupils commented that the snake was slimy and slippery!






In Maths, pupils have enjoyed Autumn nature hunts! They have been working hard to practice their counting skills.



P13 went on their first community trip to the Clent Hills. All the pupils made it to the top and enjoyed the magnificent views. The weather was glorious which helped!




Pupils showed great teamwork and kindness towards each other.




Science



Pupils have got off to an excellent start in Science this year! 5LS, 6LS and 8LS enjoyed a visit from the Animal Man learning about animals from around the world.














12US have begun their partnership with Bromsgrove School and spent some time getting to know the Bromsgrove students with a spaghetti and marshmallow tower building competition!
