The Role

We are seeking a compassionate and dedicated **Medical Interventions Assistant** to join our multidisciplinary team. This role is vital in supporting pupils with complex medical needs, ensuring their health and wellbeing throughout the school day.

- Assist with medical procedures such as but not limited to gastrostomy feeding, catheter care, and administration of medication (training provided)
- Monitor pupils' health and respond appropriately to medical needs
- Work closely with nursing staff, therapists, and teaching teams to ensure holistic care
- Support pupils in accessing learning and social activities safely both within the curriculum and during out of hours care such as playschemes and after school clubs
- Maintain accurate records of medical interventions and incidents
- Promote dignity, independence, and inclusion for all pupils
