TEACHER JOB SPECIFICATION

Key Responsibilities and Expectations:

1. Planning and Teaching:

- Plan and teach well-structured lessons, following an appropriate curriculum, that meet the individual needs of pupils, including those with profound and multiple learning disabilities or physical disabilities.
- Adapt teaching methods and resources to maximise learning for pupils with complex needs.
- Set high expectations which motivate and challenge pupils, leading to good progress and outcomes.
- Demonstrate good curriculum knowledge.
- Include life skills, communication and independence as integral parts of the curriculum.
- Use and maintain appropriate access technology and sensory resources to support learning.

2. Assessment and Monitoring:

- Accurately assess and record pupils' progress using school systems (e.g. SOLAR, Chadsgrove P-Steps, or other agreed frameworks).
- Set and regularly review EHCP targets and IEPs
- Use assessment data to inform teaching, interventions and adaptations to meet pupils' needs.

3. Behaviour and Pastoral Care:

- Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils.
- Promote positive behaviour and support pupils' emotional and social development.
- Implement strategies to develop independence and self-regulation.
- Work with parent carers and external agencies to support pupils' development.

4. Collaboration and Leadership:

- Work collaboratively with Teaching Assistants, therapists and other professionals to ensure coordinated support for pupils.
- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's vision and values.

5. Professional Standards and Compliance:

- Maintain professional conduct and uphold all school policies, including safeguarding, health and safety and equality.
- Participate in arrangements for the appraisal and review of own performance and, where appropriate, that of other teachers and support staff.



- Ensure compliance with statutory SEND requirements and national guidance.
- Engage in continuing professional development relevant to SEND.
- Supporting the PGCE SEND Programme, delivering training and welcoming trainees into class.
- Leading CPD.
