

- 12US this works well with your summer sculpture project..




Drawing and Painting

- Now you have a go...






Bug House

- Build a bug house in your garden

- Sticks
- Pine cones

- Plant pots (these could be broken, the bugs don't mind)
- Think about small spaces where bugs can hide

- You could think of something different
- Maybe a plastic bottle with the ends chopped off...
- Maybe an old flower pot
- Be creative and have fun!

Bubble Writing Practice

- It is always fun to work with letters and words

Garden Art

- Junk Jellyfish Windssock!
- My instructions are difficult to read so I'll write them out again for you, **you will need adult help to do this....**
- Find a recycled bottle* cut the lid off* chop the bottle into strips towards its base* light a candle* very carefully hold each strip over the candle* it will melt, bend, warp and shrink!* repeat with each strip* add decoration to your jellyfish and string to hang her up by* Your fabulous creation is complete!
- 12US this could be good practice for your garden sculpture work this term...



Junk Jellyfish

Washed bottle • cut the lid off • chop the bottle into strips towards its base • light a candle • very carefully hold each strip over the candle • it will melt, bend, warp and shrink! • repeat with each strip • add decoration to your jellyfish and string to hang her up by • your fabulous creation is complete!



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
