Indiana practiced some beautiful writing of graphemes in Phonics.



The Story of Macbeth as never told before...

10US have been learning about key aspects of "The Tragedy of Macbeth" and the end result was they participated in storytelling. The play was created over a few weeks, enabling the pupils to control the narrative. This was achieved through making choices, with their likes, dislikes and preferences all being accounted for. Pupils had opportunities to engage with text and explore an array of resources linked to the story. These ranged from objects to touch, ICT equipment to operate, things to taste & smell, as well as music and instruments to play, to accompany the story. We had so much fun and lots of laughter! We all played a character, and of course, Mrs Mole insisted on being Lady Macbeth!!!



11US



11US have been working hard in Phonics. They have been reading and spelling phase 4 CCCVCC words. Some of these words are very tricky! They have also been writing sentences including these words and remembering finger spaces, full stops and capital letters.



In Music, the class are learning all about 'structure' and how they can build up short musical ideas to make them into complete pieces for a performance. They have composed rhythmic ostinatos (repeated patterns) and learnt a selection of melodic ostinatos from a piece called Winter Bonfire by Prokofiev. After playing these on chime bars, hand bells and Clarion (on the iPad), they then learnt to perform them on the keyboard.

















12US have had a great start to the new school year!

Pupils in 12US have welcomed two new members to the class and everyone has already settled well into new routines and are working hard in all lessons. As part of the alternative curriculum during the first week back, pupils decorated clay cupcakes to signify their birthdays on the tiered birthday cake on 12US's notice board. In Art, pupils have been working towards producing some practical evidence based on the theme of mushrooms and fungi for their Young Leader's award project with Kew Gardens. Pupils were exploring colours in oil pastel. The whole class recently prepared an informative assembly for the award and each member of the class presented some interesting facts about mushrooms and fungi.

In Food Tech, pupils have planned simple healthy breakfast alternatives and have demonstrated working independently and in pairs to cook breakfast muffins and American style pancakes.

Some pupils in 12US recently attended the Life Beyond School event at Sixways Stadium, Worcester, as part of preparing them for adulthood and spent the day visiting and talking to colleges and companies about courses and opportunities after they leave Chadsgrove.





13US

P13 had a fantastic first community trip to Webbs Garden Centre. They discovered Flora Fields, a pick your own flowers area, and thought the flowers looked beautiful. They enjoyed the sensory garden walk and exploring the willow sculptures in the Woodland Walk. The class did really well putting the knowledge they had learned about car park safety into practice.













P14 have been very busy during the Autumn term. We have developed our Business Enterprise where we are making forever flowers with different types of materials including paper and crochet. The name of our company is 'The Paper Roses' and the pupils all made their flowers for the logo. We have made beautiful clouds for our 'dream' topic this term that are proudly displayed on our new story display board. We have also been doing a lot of movement whilst the sun is shining and going out and about on the trikes.
